
SUMMER READ 2021 & BEANSTACK



If 3 team members escape, each member will earn an extra 3 thousand points. If 2 team members escape, each member will earn an extra 1 thousand points. There will be no extra points for 1 team member escaping.

Everyone will have get to play twice. So work as a team and help each other escape together!
